

Project Manager Integrated Degree Apprenticeship

Key features:

- A Level 6 apprenticeship designed by employers for project management staff;
- Includes a BA (Hons) or BSc (Hons) degree, delivered part-time by a Higher Education Institution (HEI) or University;
- Typically completed over four years, with on-the-job and off-the-job training, it is a work-based programme for anyone aged 18 or over living and working in England;
- Ideal for both school leavers and employees with appropriate level 3 academic or vocational qualifications (96 UCAS points or above) – and usually with Maths and English at Level 2;
- Apprentices receive a salary and have their training paid for by their employer;
- The training comprises on-programme learning delivered by approved employers, HEIs and training providers with an end-point assessment (EPA);
- The on-programme learning includes an IPMA Level D qualification (or equivalent) such as the APM Project Management Qualification (PMQ). This qualification is a recognised industry standard for project management;
- The EPA allows the apprentice to demonstrate application of their knowledge to project management. This assessment comprises a portfolio of evidence, presentation and a professional discussion, assessed by independent assessors;
- While on the programme, apprentices can apply for free Student membership of the APM;
- After completing the standard, successful apprentices can apply for full APM membership (MAPM);
- APM is a partner in the Project Manager standard and provides the external quality assurance for the EPA.
